The **Western Pacific Region Index Medicus (WPRIM)** is a project of the WHO Western Pacific Regional Office in collaboration with several institutions in its Member States. This is the Region's contribution to the Global Health Library (GHL) initiative which aims to extend to all the benefits of the knowledge that is essential to the fullest attainment of health. WPRIM will be deployed and hosted, along with the index medici of other WHO Regions, at the Global Index Medicus portal under the GHL platform, where searches can be conducted individually or simultaneously through a federated search engine.

Goal

The creation of an online index of medical and health journals published in Member States of the WHO Western Pacific Region which can be accessed on the Internet thus ensuring global accessibility of medical and health research done in the Region.

Objectives

- To index selected medical/health journals in Member States of the WHO Western Pacific Region.
- To create a bibliographic database containing records linked to their full text.
- To raise the level of journal publishing in Member States of the WHO Western Pacific Region through a peer-review system.
- To build the capacity of participating health institutions.

Note

All journals must be approved by the Regional Journal Selection Committee before inclusion of any of their articles or abstracts in the WPRIM database.

Activities of WPRIMJ

- Selecting candidate journals for WPRIM (by Adopting additional journal selection criteria in addition to the WPRIM minimum requirements)
- Preparing bibliographic data for the WPRIM database
- Cooperating with editors' association

WPRIM Journal Selection Criteria

- Cover health and biomedical subjects
- Be peer-reviewed, either internally or externally
- Have English abstracts
- Be regularly published (at least 2 issues per year)
- Include “Instructions to Authors” reviewed and accepted by the National Journal Selection Committee.

Additional Journal Selection Criteria of WPRIMJ

- Not indexed in MEDLINE
- Include “Instructions to Authors” referring to Clinical Trial Registration CONSORT statement

Welcome to the CONSORT Website

CONSORT stands for Consolidated Standards of Reporting Trials and encompasses various initiatives developed by the CONSORT Group to alleviate the problems arising from inadequate reporting of randomized controlled trials.

The CONSORT Statement

The main product of CONSORT is the [CONSORT Statement](#), which is an evidence-based, minimum set of recommendations for reporting randomized trials. It offers a standard way for authors to prepare reports of trial findings, facilitating their complete and transparent reporting, and aiding their critical appraisal and interpretation.

The CONSORT Statement comprises a 25-item [checklist](#) and a [flow diagram](#). The checklist items focus on reporting how the trial was designed, analyzed, and interpreted; the flow diagram displays the progress of all participants through the trial. The [CONSORT "Explanation and Elaboration" document](#) explains and illustrates the principles underlying the CONSORT Statement. We strongly recommend that it is used in conjunction with the CONSORT Statement. In addition, [extensions of the CONSORT Statement](#) have been developed to give additional guidance for RCTs with specific designs, data and interventions.

Preparation of Bibliographic Data of WPRIM Journals

- Japanese WPRIM journals are digitally published by J-STAGE, e-journal platform developed by Japan Science and Technology Agency (JST)
- JST generates XML-form bibliographic files of articles in the Japanese WPRIM journals
- IMICAMS collects and converts the files, and uploads them to the WPRIM database

IMICAMS: Institute of Medical Information Chinese Academy of Medical Sciences

Cooperation with the Japanese Association of Medical Journal Editors (JAMJE)

- Conduct surveys
